

 - 2. Child Awareness training
 - 3. References
 - 4. Interview
 - 5. Committee Approval



Code of Conduct - Children

Children

Players should play according to the laws and spirit of the game

Players should **respect** your fellow players & opposition, bullying will not be tolerated

Players should display self-control in all situations. Never use foul, abusive or racist language

Players should **respect the referee**. Never dispute his or her decisions. They are only human and they make mistakes, just like you

Players should turn up for training and matches in appropriate and clean clothing

Parents

Be your child's best fan and **support** him / her unconditionally

Parents / carers must not **coach** from the touchline during matches or training

All **issues** should be directed through the coaches and never brought up directly with any children

Remember – winning is not as important as the **performance**

Parents/carers should never audibly dispute a **referee's** decision

The game is for the **children**. It is not for the glory of the coach, manager or parents.

- Higher number of mid-week games in April / May and September
- Interim/Transition/Half Season for second half of 2016
